During Term 3 We Will Learn About...

Below are the key learning experiences for Term 3, activities designed to encourage your child to learn new knowledge, skills, values and attitudes. Please use this information to support and discuss with your child what they are learning in class. We thank you for your continued support.



Literacy (including reading, writing, talking and listening)

By the end of Term 3 most children will be able to:

- Use a few techniques (verbal and non-verbal) when engaging with others, for example, vocabulary, eye contact, expression and/or body language. (class talk)
- Use capital letters question marks and full stops in the right places.
- Write for different purposes - report, letter, poster, poem, etc
- Read with expression.
- Spell and read words with known sounds, including rhyming words. (Wraparound Spelling)

Numeracy and Mathematics

By the end of Term 3, most children will be able to:

- Recall the multiplication facts for x3 and x4
- Understand that repeated addition is the foundation of times tables.
- Use coins to make values up to £2
- Estimate and measure the length of objects using metres and half metres.
- Use kg and 1/2kg to estimate and weigh objects.
- Use litres and $\frac{1}{2}$ litres to estimate and measure volume.

Health and Wellbeing

By the end of Term 3, most children will be able to:

- Identify their health and wellbeing rights.
- Understand their feelings, how they can change and affect others.
- To take part in simple team games (following rules, working as part of a team)

Interdisciplinary Studies-

By the end of Term 3, most children will:

- Draws comparisons between modern life and life from a time in the past.
- Use different sources to find out information about the past (The Vikings)
- Identify ways in which our lives are influenced by the Vikings
- Develop an understanding of how the Vikings live.
